### ITEM 2: RATIFICATION OF DIRECTORS' FEES AND EXPENSES, TENTATIVE FUTURE MEETINGS/ATTENDANCE

Mr. Perea presented the Directors' Fees and Expenses Report and Tentative Future Meetings/Attendance Report for Committee consideration and review. Director Mandich mentioned that the OC Watershed meeting will be held on November 17, 2022. Mr. Perea indicated the meeting schedule would be updated as such.

Mr. Perea mentioned that he is currently negotiating with Ferguson for a project credit for the appropriate meters, and he will have more information to report later. There was a brief discussion on the meter installation schedule.

Ms. Warner presented the preliminary unaudited financials for September 2022, and she highlighted the following items:

### **Operating Revenue, Water Commodity Sales**

Ms. Warner reported that this line item was higher than the year to date due to the current warmer weather conditions.

### **Operating Revenue, Baker Treatment Plant Sales**

Ms. Warner reported that this line item was lower than budgeted for year to date due to less water sales to the City of San Clemente.

### **Operating Revenue, Reclaimed Water Sales**

Ms. Warner reported that water demand for the month was significantly higher than the year to date due to increased system demands.

### Operating Revenue, Recycled Water Sales

Ms. Warner reported that water demand for the month was higher than the year to date due to increased system demands.

### Operating Expense, Source of Supply

Ms. Warner reported that this line item was higher than budgeted for the year due to increased electrical and chemical costs for treatment.

### **District Capital FY 2022-23 (Unaudited)**

Ms. Warner reviewed the capital expenditures to date by project, and provided a brief overview of the September costs.

### ITEM 4: MEMBERSHIP IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA WATER COALITION

Founded in 1984, Southern California Water Coalition (formerly known as Southern California Water Committee) is a nonprofit, nonpartisan public education partnership with a broad-based membership from across Southern California, representing business, regional and local government, agricultural groups, labor unions, water agencies, and the general public. SCWC approaches issue education from a statewide perspective and focuses primarily on water supply reliability and quality related to Colorado River, State Water Project/Delta Conveyance, stormwater, water recycling, and legislative policy. The SCWC is governed by a Board of Trustees from the business, agricultural, county and city government, and water sectors, and led by its Executive Director Charlie Wilson.

SCWC holds workshops and networking events throughout the year, including well-attended Quarterly Luncheons and Annual Dinner that feature panel discussions and keynote speakers on relevant topics. Trabuco Canyon Water District frequently attends SCWC events.
