

LOWER WATER RATE ADJUSTMENTS BEGINNING JULY 1

Water service rates and charges were adjusted on July 1. As reported in the June On Tap Newsletter, the TCWD Board of Directors approved a smaller adjustment to rates and charges than originally authorized after conducting a financial review to identify areas of cost savings that can be passed on to TCWD customers. Such reviews will be performed on an annual basis in the months prior to rate adjustments to compare actual financial conditions against rate study assumptions. This year, the Board's approved reduction will average approximately 5% for TCWD customers and will be applied to August water bills.

PFAS INFORMATION

TCWD has NOT detected PFAS in its water supplies.

The District is committed to providing safe, reliable water to our customers and community 24/7. PFAS (per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances) have been in the news lately, and District staff compiled the facts below to help keep our customers informed.

WHAT ARE PFAS?

In April 2024, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a new national drinking water standard targeting PFAS, a large group of manufactured chemicals prevalent in many everyday products. The presence of PFAS in certain water supplies and the new EPA standard has received extensive media coverage.

YOUR WATER IS SAFE TO DRINK

- The water that TCWD provides to our customers is safe to drink. Protecting our customers' health and safety is TCWD's top priority. Your drinking water meets or exceeds the stringent water quality standards by the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) and in California by the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB).
- The EPA continually monitors and regulates contaminants to ensure compliance with healthbased guidelines. These standards are based on extensive scientific research and are continuously updated to reflect the latest findings.

TCWD RIGOROUSLY TESTS YOUR WATER FOR PUBLIC SAFETY

- TCWD has NOT detected PFAS in its water supplies.
- Every year, TCWD conducts hundreds of tests on your tap water to ensure it's clean and safe to drink and use at your home or business.
- Our staff continuously samples and monitors our systems, protecting your health, safety and peace of mind. We monitor our water system 24/7 to ensure its safety.
- TCWD does not overlie the Orange County Groundwater Basin, where PFAS has been detected and is being remediated by Orange County Water District, which manages the Basin. OCWD is a good source of information on PFAS in the water supply; visit www.ocwd.com.

EPA STANDARDS IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINE FOR WATER AGENCIES

- The new EPA standards will be phased in over a period of five years. Water agencies must complete initial monitoring and inform customers within three years.
- If a system exceeds the stipulated PFAS levels, it has two additional years to implement capital improvements to reduce these contaminants.

The District's largest ongoing capital project, the rehabilitation of the Golf Club Sewer Lift Station, is over 50% complete. A second phase will begin in early July and focus on upgrading mechanical components like pumps and valves — work which will require a complete bypass of the station. The entire project will be completed by early October 2024.

The District completed several smaller projects focused on safety and cost savings at the Dimension Water Treatment Plant, where TCWD treats water imported from the Colorado River to drinking water standards, including:

- Installing LED lighting in Dimension's filter building to improve worker safety and reduce energy consumption.
- Refurbishing, rather than replacing, an office trailer housing the water operations crew, resulting in significant cost savings.


